

Lubenham All Saints CE Primary - Pupil Premium Report 2016-17

Context

This report will outline the impact Pupil Premium spending has had in our school this year. This is funding allocated to the school and is based on the number of pupils who have been eligible for Free School Meals in the last six years, or who are looked after by the Local Authority.

The Pupil Premium money which Lubenham All Saints receives in our school budget is used to make a contribution to the cost of a range of intervention and support programmes. This targeted support ensures that all of our children are supported in their learning so that they can make the best possible progress. We identify areas of need for particular children through careful data analysis and discussion with staff, parents and children. We then plan the best intervention strategies to address these needs and track the children's progress through discussions with class teachers at half termly Pupil Progress meetings; this enables us to measure the impact of any additional funding we receive.
