

## Impact of PE and Sport Grant 2016/17

This report summarises how Lubenham All Saints Primary School has allocated its PE and Sport Grant for the 2016/17 academic year. This is a government grant, provided to schools with the intention of improving and enhancing the quality of PE and sport for all pupils.

### 2016/17 objectives:

- To improve the quality of teaching and learning in PE and Sport
- To increase student engagement with physical activity
- To expand the range and diversity of PE sporting activities and experiences available
- To support teachers and teaching assistants professional learning in PE and sport
- To successfully gain the School Games Mark 2016-17.
- To improve pupil performance in competitive sport at local level
- To provide equipment to support outdoor physical activities for KS1/LKS2 pupils.

### During the year, the sports grant has been be used to:

- Purchase a substantial piece of equipment
- Develop coaching skills across the school
- Extend the range of opportunities available to pupils
- Employ specialist sports coaches
- Membership of the South Leicestershire Partnership
- Provide opportunities for pupils to participate in inter-school sports competitions
- Improve pupil's health and wellbeing through physical exercise.

A detailed breakdown of some of the key expenditure is provided below along with the beneficial impact of this investment

Adventure Playground Equipment		The Oakwood Galleon was purchased and installed in May 2016. This single significant investment has had a number of major beneficial impacts against the 2016/17 objectives and is a showpiece item demonstrating the schools ambition and potential. All children, across all age groups, have

		<p>utilised the Galleon being very physical climbing, sliding, pulling, jumping and rocking on the different parts of the equipment. Children also have engaged in imaginative play, which has boosted creativity and aspects of problem solving in a fun environment. Joint activities between peers and different KS children has developed social interaction, co-operation and interaction in such areas as turn talking, helping others, role play etc.</p>
South Leicestershire Partnership Fees		<p>The south Leicestershire fees were used to support initiatives such as inclusive coaching, mini GALS project and Sports Ambassador training etc. Designed to increase student engagement success was achieved by increased participation of girls whilst class 4 benefitted through targeted specialist training for individual pupils.</p>

Achieving increased levels of ability and confidence allowed participation in local tournaments such as the Syd East Football Tournament and the Football Tournament for small schools within the Academy.</p> <p>Coaching delivered within normal curriculum time supported training of teaching assistants and teachers as defined as a key objective. Skills were enhanced in gymnastics, orienteering, dance, and athletic. These skills and knowledge are now embedded within existing staff to be delivered in future teaching.</p> <p>A specialised programme designed to aid children with delayed physical developed was delivered to KS1 pupils.</p>
Martial Arts – Kempo Jujitsu		<p>To provide diversity in the range of physical activities the children can undertake a martial arts tutor delivered workshops to both KS1 and KS2. This was very successful and we were able to offer a 6 week after school course to interested children As a result it meant that 2 children enrolled who had previously never participated in any after school club.</p>

Entry fees and badges		Sports Ambassador badges and affiliation fees to local clubs to be able to enter events e.g. cross country, football, swimming. Participation in inter school sports allowed pupils to develop competitive skills by competing in a wider community.
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
